It is essential that children have experienced successfully sleeping away for the night prior to the trip.


<u>Please</u> do not tell your child you can come and pick them up-this is distressing for the child and stops them settling and is also distressing and unfair for other children.

#### Housekeeping: reminders

- Water Bottles please bring in a named refillable water bottle daily
- Uniform please name all items
- Pencil cases and equipment are provided for all lessons-no need to bring any
- Jewellery is not permitted in school except for plain gold and silver stud earrings
- Long hair should be tied back for safety and to support learning
- PE days no earrings and long hair tied back please
- Playtime snacks healthy snacks (fruit and vegetables-no chocolate/crisps)
- Mobile Phones and smart watches are to be handed in each morning
- Walking home/change of arrangements-permission must be emailed to year 6 team in advance

# Online Safety

- Biggest issue (and growing) is use of mobile phones
- all of this is outside of school
- What's App groups need to be monitored regularly



### Summer Term Assessments & Transition

KS2 Tests are 12th-15th May 2025 :

- Reading, GPAS, Maths (Arithmetic and 2 Reasoning papers)
- Writing is moderated and assessed from work across the year
- Data is shared with secondary schools
- Flourish lead sessions preparing the children for transition to their new school
- Induction day See Secondary School websites for key information

## Preparing to leave

- Transition meetings with secondaries
- Appeals: we are only allowed to provide data not character references on a standard form. We will provided allocated time for anyone wishing to meet re appeals but it is the parent not the school who appeals.
- Post 11 plus: learning does not stop but is vitally important for secondary transition readiness
- Being mindful of late allocation
- Being mindful of different feelings about leaving
- Focus on celebrating time together and time in school after summer half-term
