Making a rucksack





Start by photocopying the templates onto card or paper.



Cut out your rucksack

- Each child needs one rucksack template
- Two children can share a page with the handle, front pocket and fastenings (they just need to cut that in half to have one set each)







Glue on the straps

- Fold down the top flap and turn the rucksack over
- Glue the shoulder straps on the back of the rucksack: they should loop over and stick at the top and the bottom of the rucksack
- Glue on the rucksack handle



Front straps and pocket

- Glue on the front pocket (apply glue to three edges of the pocket so that it is open at the top)
- Fold over the top flap and glue on the front fastenings so that the strap with buttons tucks into the fastener







Things I would pack

- Fill your rucksack with the most important things that you would pack for a friend
- Add this list to the area of the bag under the top flap
- It doesn't just have to be things that fit in a rucksack. You could include friends, teachers, favourite subjects, sports or a special book
- Colour in some paper icons and add these to the front pocket



A message in a school bag

 Write your message to world leaders: think about how you can persuade them to act and to help children in crisis around the world





Don't forget to make your rucksack stand out by decorating it to look really colourful!
