The Year 6 Reading Buddies have started reading with Year 1 pupils every lunchtime in the library.




Visits to West Kirby Library have been organised for most year groups. Years 4, 5 and 6 will go before half term and years 2 and 3 will visit after half term


# Spooktacular Reads for Halloween:
