Phonics

- Daily sessions using Read Write Inc. These will consist of sound cards, real words, alien words and red words. Writing.
- Your child will receive a book to practise at home that contain the sounds they are practising based on their RWI assessment.
- Phonics screening.

Activities include;

- partner work
- speed sounds, word and sentence generation
- Special friend, Fred Talk, read the word.



Reading with your child - how you can help.

•Read with your child each night and use phonic 'blending' strategies to decode unfamiliar words. Eg m/i/l/k or sh/ee/p. We call this Fred Talk. Once the children have decoded the words in a sentence it is good practise to reread the sentence for fluency.

 We will be reading with your child every day during our phonic sessions.



Reading with your child - Active read

We have a specific Active read lesson each week to teach the children reading skills.

- Prediction-what happens next
- Inference-read between the lines
- Language-new vocabulary and punctuation
- Sequencing-retelling the story and ordering key events

Examples of questions you could ask:

What do you think would happen if?

Why do you think they said that?

How were they feeling?


Was the dog feeling happy? Why?


E-Safety
